<b>2</b>	<b>Enfield's Shared Lives Scheme</b>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Wally and Wendy spoke briefly about the scheme. This is a way of providing respite and care services in the home of another family. This is similar to foster caring. 'Shared carer' families apply to be employed to provide these services for disabled people.</li> <li>The 'shared carers' are paid, and carefully selected and screened, with all appropriate checks being made.</li> <li>When a family, with a disabled family member, wishes to be considered to use this service, they will be offered a choice of 'shared carers', who might be suitable and willing to provide care. Over a period of time the families get to know one another, and the disabled person will be offered a slow transition, working towards staying with the 'shared carer' for longer periods of time.</li> <li>The following link gives information about this scheme: <a href="https://mylife.enfield.gov.uk/directory/providerdetails/211844">https://mylife.enfield.gov.uk/directory/providerdetails/211844</a></li> <li>One of our members had tried to use this scheme, but had not been successful in finding an appropriate 'shared carer', but we do know of another member who has very successfully used this scheme for his daughter. Obviously, it will depend on the circumstances of each family, and their requirements.</li> </ul>
